Footpath blocked off in Claydon Barham to stop riders accessing the quarry pit and causing nuisance, Thank you for the police assistance, struggling to find an alternative location for dirt bike use.

There are lawful sites that can be used but they have to have insurance and pay to use them sites which is why these people use the places and they have an app showing sites they can use unlawfully, Blyborough springs to mind

Any motor bike used off road and causing a nuisance can be warned first and a section 59 issued, if they get stopped again in any vehicle the vehicle cab be seized.

Footpath had been blocked off to stop bike access as the bikers were disturbing wildlife and badger sets.

John Hinton East Bergholt, Threshold of getting a camera van to certain areas, speed van has to have clear line of site and be safely parked to operate. Road strips are used to survey traffic speeds which the data would then dictate if a camera van is needed.

East Bergholt have a new traffic Management Survey released New developments will increase traffic in Bergholt and Brantham

Speeding in Claydon, does not seem to be addressed, going to Great Blakenham Business park, speeding around the roundabout entering Claydon revving engines and back firing, under the A14, 1 car backfired 6 times, Nothing reported on line so please phone in or online forms so the police can record it and gives them time of day etc, please report it so the police are aware of the problem and when it happens, that way the police can identify the issue and culprits.

We identify vehicles using the bus gate, would this be better to report it online, but if we are getting the information already then we can see how we can put measures in place
